“To whom much is given, much will be expected.” Father Mario spent some time this week talking to us about this part of our Gospel reading.

Jesus was telling us, through a parable, or story, about some of God’s expectations for us. In the story, He told us about a servant who had been goofing around, instead of doing what his master had asked of him. This master came home unexpectedly one day,

and found the servant playing around, instead of working. He became very angry with the servant, who got in a lot of trouble.

In the same way, we don’t know when our time is up, and when God, our Master, will come home. Will He find us working hard, doing His will? Or will He find us goofing around, doing what we want to do, instead?

Another thing to consider is that part about God expecting a lot from those to whom He’s given a lot. Fr. Mario pointed out that this doesn’t mean just the Pope, bishops, priests, or other clerics. It also means each of us, as we take on roles of teachers (of each other, or of students) or maybe parents. We have each received blessings from God, and we should all try to live up to the standards He sets for us, with His divine help.
