## Open Our Hearts to Listen to You

This week, at Mass, Fr. Antony talked to us about listening. The responsorial psalm started “Open our hearts to listen to You.” And in the Gospel reading, Jesus also taught us about listening to Him and, by extension, to the Father who sent Jesus to us.

Fr. Antony reminded us that we normally use our ears to hear. That is, to hear the physical world around us. But God usually speaks to us in a spiritual sense. And so, we

need to listen with our hearts.

In order to do this, we first need to prepare ourselves to listen. This preparation comes in several ways. For one, we need to pray, on a daily basis. Also, we need to study God’s Word. Finally, the sacraments will also help us to develop the “ears” of the heart.

Next, we need to start listening with our hearts. The Holy Spirit will speak

to us, and we need to trust that He will. Next, we need to pay attention to our innermost feelings. Anything that brings us peace, calm, and joy are fruits of the Holy Spirit, and we can trust that such thoughts are given to us by Him. On the other hand, if we feel anxious or worried, then these ideas and thoughts are certainly not of God.

God is loving, gracious and merciful. He wants to talk to us, and bring us closer to Him. Amen!
