## “They do not belong to the world...”

This week, at Mass, Fr. Antony talked to us about one of Jesus’ last prayers before His Passion and Resurrection. Jesus prayed to the Father to protect His flock (His disciples and, later, us) from the evil one. He talked about how the world hated Him and His followers, because “they do not belong to the world.”

And so, Fr. Antony asked the question: are we of the world (i.e. Satan), or are we of God?

One example he offered was regarding the weather. Many people get cheerful and happy in warm weather that’s full of

sunshine. Similarly, many people get sad and glum when the weather is overcast and rainy. These people are of the world. If you are of God, you wouldn’t let an external force, like the weather, control your moods and emotions. God made both the sun and rain and they both serve a vital purpose in the life and health of this world that He created.

Another example involved his own personal experience in coming to America. He was initially bothered by the government’s designation of him as a “legal alien.” It was the “alien” part that really concerned him. But, after some

reflection, he actually was happy about it. He saw the truth in it, because he really wanted to be of God and not of the world. If you follow God’s law of love, the world will hate you for it. You may be consider an “outsider” - or even an “alien.” After that revelation, he was actually joyful of the reminder that he is not of this world, but of God.

So, when you’re out there enjoying this beautiful sunshine, remember that you can be happy, not so much because of the amazing world, but rather because of the One who made it!
