Upside Down

Fr. Mario wanted to read to us about Jesus. Too bad he was missing his glasses and had the book upside down! He couldn't read anything!

So, too, does the world. Sometimes, the world get things upside down, confusing right with wrong.

So, sometimes Jesus needs to turn things "upside down," in order to get them right-side up again. He shows a way of looking at things, God's way, that is often very different from

the way we, as humans, might look at things.

One example is in this week's Gospel. Jesus told his disciples that they had to leave their relatives behind, even their own lives, if they were to follow Him. He wasn't speaking literally, of course, but rather trying to show us that He must be first in our lives.

In another example, Jesus told us that whoever is first will be last and whoever is last will be first in the

Kingdom of heaven. Jesus gave one of the best examples of this "upside-down" way of thinking when the disciples tried to "shoo" away some children that wanted to visit with Him, after He'd had an especially long and hard day. Jesus insisted that His disciples allow the children to come and visit with Him. He reminded them, as He reminds us all, that "whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." How blessed we are, to have the witness of children, showing us how to be great in the Kingdom of Heaven!
